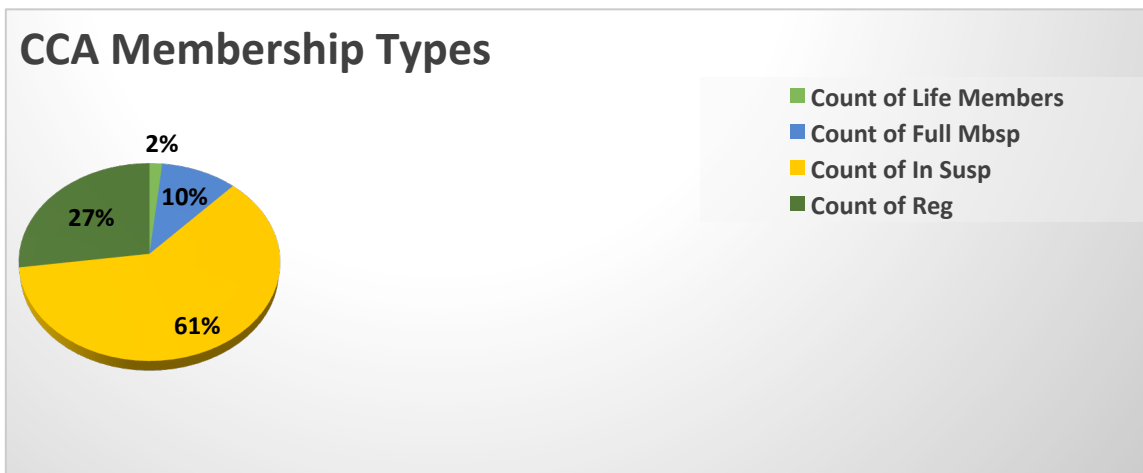

Brian Crawford, Board Chair, called the annual meeting to order. Reported on how excellent was the experience of the tour in Scotland with Craufurdland. Makes us more connected to the Crawford Clan. Urged anyone who could participate to do so.

### (1) STATE OF THE ASSOCIATION (Kevan Crawford, President)

Kevan reported on the Bannockburn 700th Anniversary Celebration and Craufurdland Castles hosting of the Crawford home coming tour this past year. He reviewed the diversity of the Board and Executive with representation all over the world. Research to identify the most senior person in the clan. Has branched off to a cadet line. Membership is an important topic How to develop and retain it. We have a membership committee, also a Tent committee. Topic f membership communication and having a conveyor group. Simon has presented a new topic to restore historic Craufurdland flag. Georgina sponsoring a bid to get funds to restore. Develop a relationship with the Crafoord Foundation in Sweden. Adopted son of a Crafoord who did very well in industry. Founded foundation to award grants for science and technology. Have thought to approach them to support restoration of Craufurdland Castle and the development of a Crawford Foundation.



(2) ANNUAL SECRETARY'S REPORT (Peter Crawford, Secretary)

Peter reported concerns about the number of members. He reported the number of members and types as above. Too few renew. Peter corresponding with Directors and getting their cooperation to communicate with regional members and past members. Importance of giving to the Association rather than taking the position that membership primary should think in terms of what they can get. He urged the importance of thinking in terms of what they can give to the Association. Otherwise, the Association can't thrive. Loss of members means loss of revenue. Broken membership by region and by status. Will be writing regional directors to help in reaching out to the membership to support the renewal process. Interested in discussion about how handle attendees at regional events.

Discussion:

Question by Adam providing option for automatic annual renewals. Gets notice a few weeks before. Brian and Joanne supported the idea. PayPal can facilitate it.

Brian mentioned the importance of "added value". He suggested also help on genealogy. What if we were to contact Family Tree and talk to them about some discount off their normal pricing and build a basic DNA package (20% off) into our membership, and also add in a couple of our publications? Dues would need to be adjusted to cover, of course.

Adam suggested combine with membership that automatically renews.

Syd supports idea. She also pointed out that there is no category for renewal on the

Karen had 14 Crawfords sign in at the last game; there were a few renewals, too. Printed out copies of latest Newsletter and had them to be taken with them. Talk to people about FTDNA. People wanted to join right then, but difficulties with internet connection.

Peter likes about the DNA package. His has had problems with FTDNA; he has not been able to get results and difficulties with receiving full services since outside US. Patrick in Ireland also has had trouble receiving results. FTDNA indicates that problems due to Ancestry. His perspective is that if he has contracted for services, he should be receiving them. Joanne indicated we needed to contact FTDNA to correct that issue.

Joanne reminded tent conveners to send in names of those that sign in at the games.

Christine asked what the negative response was that Peter heard back. Peter indicated that it had to do with a female who was evidently offended that a woman born Crawford, did not belong to the clan.

Kevan clarified that the statement on the website was from the Lyon Court.

**(5) REPORTS OF ON RESULTS OF RESEARCH INTO GENEALOGY OF THE SENIOR CRAWFORD LINE (Raymond Crawford, Vice-President)**

Raymond reported on process related to the chiefship. Most recent information is in newsletter and documents sent out for this meeting. In particular, see article titled "Search for a Crawford Chief, Another Step Forward." Next step is to ask the Lord Lyon to appoint a chief of Crawfords. It's a legal process thus we need to follow the process the Lord Lyon indicates. Raymond would like the CCA Board to agree to ask the Lord Lyon to call for a Crawfordd family convention. Next

we will need to send a letter to the Lord Lyon requesting such. The Lord Lyon has indicated he will appoint a herald to supervise the process. Second step will be for the herald appointed to agree to the rules for the convention. In newsletter article Raymond suggested we needed to invite participants. Once they are satisfied the requirements for participation are met, then we can issue invitations.

We of the clan have to make up our mind on who we want as chief. Our research points to Sir Robert as the most senior person best in the line to be the chief. If we are to follow genealogy and history, Sir Robert would be the person who is next in line. There are some difficulties along the way. There is no actual statement that Crawford of Auchenames are the chiefs of the Crawfords. The Lord Lyon indicated that the fact that we have done all this research, we shouldn't have to wait longer than necessary to determine the chief. It would be nice to have him appointed and have him become the chief within three years. We have proved our point that we are eligible for a chief.

One matter for the clan to discuss is are we happy to go down the line of history and genealogy or do we want to thank of somebody who would be a better clan chief. A problem might be that the chief, once appointed, is hereditary. Usually his eldest son. So if he doesn't have a son or heir, we are back to square one. Discussion would suggest most Crawfords think we should take the route of history and genealogy. Sir Robin would be a good choice and it would give us a good time to find someone else. To call a clan convention it needs to be at least six month after date requested. This gives us time to think over the matter. Not necessarily does it have to be someone living in Scotland. Many of the Scottish chiefs live outside Scotland.

The cost of making an application is minimal. There are no legal costs. We do have to pay the costs of the Scottish herald — possibly between £300 and £500. The herald charges for his time. If we meet with him/her in Edinburgh, there would be less costs. Raymond said he was willing to go up to Edinburgh to handle the negotiations. We will need to decide who we want to be chief and a date for the Family Convention.

Discussion: Mary asked how much notice do we have before the convention. Raymond said could be at the earliest in September of this year. Joanne confirmed that the convention would be held in Scotland, and with additional participation by skype. If we agree on the candidate, we tell the lord Lyon who it is and he names him as commander. After three to five years, we go back and ask the Lord Lyon to be appointed chief. The convention should be basically a formality. In the newsletter, there is a letter that members of the clan can sign and send to Raymond who would attach them to the petition, which would be signed by president and vice presidents. Peter mentioned that for him the Family Convention would need to fit into a trip to Scotland. Raymond: people would like to have another reason to go to Scotland.

Kevan asked if we needed to put this to a vote. Brian took motion stated by Kevan. Raymond clarified that the motion would be that the Association will write to the Lord Lyon to convene a Family Convention for the purpose of electing a Commander. Karen seconded. Brian asked for further discussion. There was none. Asked if there was any objections to acceptance of the motion by acclamation. Unanimously accepted, thus adopted by the Board.

Raymond had also sent the following information to the Board, which was not discussed, but provided background as to the history of Crawford chiefs. He also sent out the description of his

meeting with the Lord Lyon in February, 2015. Both are below. They were not discussed though Raymond did report orally on some of the point from the meeting with the Lord Lyon.

### **Summary of the lines of the Crawford Chiefs**

There is no clear-cut and definite pedigree for a new Chief for Clan Crawford, but as the new rules from Lyon Court allow us to present a likely candidate, I think we have a chance.

This application would present the following arguments:

- 1) Though there has been no official recognition of a Crawford Chiefship, there is historical evidence from George Craufurd and Alexander Nisbet that the Craufurds of Auchenames have for several centuries been recognized as the Chiefly line.
- 2) The last Laird of Auchenames, Hugh Ronald George Craufurd died in 1942 and his direct line is extinct.
- 3) Research has shown that all collateral branches back for four generations are definitely extinct.
- 4) Of the large family of James Craufurd (1711-1766) and Elizabeth Andrews who lived in Rotterdam all lines are extinct except for the possibility of one great-great-grandson, Pierre Crafford, born in Brussels in 1857, still there as a boy of 9, but who then disappeared and of whom no trace has been found in Belgium, the Netherlands or through family history search engines.
- 5) James had a younger brother Charles, born in Scotland in 1714 of whom nothing is known but there is no mention of him in any of the records that have been searched which give considerable information about his many brothers.
- 6) Three generations further back comes Robert Craufurd of Auchenames (1612-1673) whose great-great-grandson Colonel Robert Craufurd of Newfield (1786-1843) claimed to be the heir male of Auchenames, and whose line is on the point of extinction. His sole surviving Craufurd descendant is now an old lady with no children.
- 7) Colonel Robert Craufurd had two younger brothers John (born 1788) and Archibald (born 1790). **These brothers had children and their lines have not yet been explored. That needs to be done.**
- 8) There is a record that Robert Craufurd (1612-1673) had a younger brother John (1618-1673) who migrated to Massachusetts and established a large family. There is no record of him as being of the Auchenames in Laurus, but that doesn't rule out the possibility. It seems that this branch of the family did not come into the reckoning as heirs to Auchenames, **but we would need to explore this possible connection with Auchenames further.**
- 9) Going back a further 5 generations there are two brothers of James Craufurd of Auchenames, alive in 1483 and 1533. Of one brother, Henry we know nothing, and the other, Robert, died in 1513 at the Battle of Flodden. It is very unlikely that we will learn anything more about them.
- 10) Going back one more generation (and we are now 13 generations back from Hugh Ronald George Craufurd) we come to Thomas Craufurd, younger son of Archibald Craufurd of Auchenames. From him is descended in the direct line, **Sir Robert Craufurd, 9<sup>th</sup> Baronet of Kilbirny.**



This I think would be the skeleton of a petition for a new Chief. My understanding is that if we go forward with this application, Lord Lyon would appoint one of the Scottish heralds to oversee the process and so no doubt we would be given guidance on how much more research would be needed to satisfy Lord Lyon.

(6) APPLICATION TO THE LORD LYON FOR THE INITIATION OF THE PROCESS FOR SELECTION OF A CLAN CHIEF BY CRAWFORDS (Raymond Crawford, Vice-President)

Summary of meeting between Raymond and Lord Lyon Joseph Morrow, Feb 19 2015

- 1) He strongly recommends that we go down the route of choosing a Commander who after a specified period would then be elected by the Clan as Chief, and that that election would then be ratified by Lyon. To try to go down the route of proving that the Laird of Auchinames is the Chief and that Sir Robert is the heir to the last Laird would require a degree of proof that we just don't have or are likely to have.
- 2) It is entirely up to the Clan to choose the person to be Commander and then Chief - Lyon's role is simply to see that the election is properly carried out, and then act on the Clan's decision, giving official authority to that election.
- 3) Although the official period between electing a Commander, and the Commander then becoming Chief, is five years, where there is a strong genealogical link between the chosen person and the last Head of the Name, as, for example, there is between Sir Robert and Hugh Ronald George, Lyon would be minded to reduce that period to, say, three years.
- 4) In the event that a Commander dies, having served a significant time in that office, the Clan might be allowed to move straight on to a Petition for a Chief.
- 5) Once a Chief is officially recognized, the Chief decides who is to be his heir to the Chiefship. Normally it would be his eldest son, if he has one, but there would be no problem in his choosing, for example, a nephew as long as he bore the name Crawford. Although at present adopted children are not considered as able to inherit, Lyon hopes to see that change, so that they become eligible in due course.
- 6) We discussed briefly the problems that had arisen as a result of Lyon Sellar's decision to allow the petition of Peter Houison Craufurd for the undifferenced arms. Lyon explained that:
  - a) It was perfectly correct for his predecessor to allow the petition on the basis of the 1673 registration, even though the undifferenced arms had been previously used by other Crawfords. That was entirely correct in law.
  - b) Peter H-C's petition did not petition for the Chiefship, which has therefore not been awarded on the basis of the undifferenced arms.
  - c) In making a judgement, a Judge does not have to give his reasons for rejecting the counter-arguments, but many judges will do so in order to be more helpful.
  - d) In the event that the Clan moves to electing first a Commander then a Chief, the new Chief can then petition for Chiefly arms which, in Sir Robert's case, could include the crossed lances of the Bannockburn augmentation, as well as supporters, a clan badge, a clan plant badge and a standard.
- 7) As I see it the sequence of events is now this:
  - a) The Clan Association sends a Petition to Lord Lyon, asking him "to call a Family Convention with the aim of discovering if agreement can be reached about whom the Clan should invite you to recognise as Chief of Clan Crawford" *[these are the words used in Lyon Court's specimen document]*.
  - b) Anyone else concerned can also write to Lord Lyon asking for their name "to be included among the signatories to the Petition asking you to call etc."
  - c) Lord Lyon then appoints one of his senior officers to oversee the process.

- d) In the meantime, I suggest that we put together a list of names of people we think would be suitable to sit on the Family Convention. I have attached a first draft.
- e) We discuss among ourselves who we would like to propose or support as Commander then Chief.
- f) It has to be at least six months before the Family Convention is held, and it has to be held in Scotland but video links to members of the Convention is OK.
- g) If the Family Convention is able to agree on a person to be the Commander, the supervising officer sends a report to Lord Lyon, who issues his confirmation together with his decision as to how long before a second Family Convention can be called in order to petition for the Commander to be accepted as Chief.
- h) After the prescribed period, a second Family Convention is held at which the members decide if they want the Commander to be accepted as Chief. Normally of course, that decision is positive, unless the Commander has seriously let the side down.

Craufurdland Houison Craufurds given the honor of washing the king's hands and feet in reward for protecting the king when he had been set oppose by ruffians. Banana after first of second time had been done when the new ruler had first visited Scotland after his coronation.

Had thought of doing something to honor Peter after his passing. This seemed the most appropriate. Need to raise the funds to cover the rest of the restoration, some 1000 pounds. Fred has set up PayPal account for donations and Kevan will put the Link up on the website. Brian asked for motion. Joann: "that the association with the support of its members provide the remaining funds The association would provide matching funds to complete the amount. Christine seconded. Discussion. Terry asked for price. About 500 pounds more for a total of 1000 pounds. Will be placed in a table top display. With transportation back to Craufurdland, total expenses would come to about 1000 pounds or \$ US 1500. Fred asked about time frame. Joanne answered flexible. Peter said he wanted to contribute as soon as account set up. Fred said he had set up account, but Kevan has not yet set up link button. He is currently making changes to website and will do so as soon as can. Raymond asked to be advised when set up so her could also donate. There were no objections so Brian declared passed by acclamation.

Karen said about Scotland convention, whether would have further activities in Scotland. Karen wanted to know date of convention. Raymond suggested April since good time with weather being better, but before, thus avoiding the tourist season. Raymond recommended neutral site for convention and advantage of holding it in Edinburgh to facilitate access stop Lyon herald. Board approved the time frame and location.

Raymond the research was Dutch, not Swedish. Asked Fred to modify his report. Fred agreed he would do so.

Karen asked if signatures needed for petition. Raymond indicated not probable. He would ask for edit if needed. Peter indicated he would make adjustments to his report based on more recent data.

Brian made some closing comments, then closed the meeting thanking everyone for their time in attending the meeting, and he was looking forward to meeting with all for the family convention next year.

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Post meeting discussion on DNA after meeting adjourned regarding questions some members had about their Y-DNA results:

Returned to Peter's frustrations with FTDNA. Kevan said Peter does not yet show up in the FTDNA with results, though shows up as having joined the project and having matches. Suggests it might be a time issue, or an error on their website or server. ...Unsuccessful transfer from Ancestry. Tried to do transfer several times. They do not provide the service intros region. They simply ... Gone to help desk, but they did not reply. Kevan said not unusual. Thinks they do not get to it in many cases. Went up the ladder, but replied that the problem is with Ancestry. Kevan asked if had called on phone. Peter said no. Kevan supported by Brian indicated that might help. Karen said that her dad's results also were delayed for a long time. Joanne explained that Ancestry had gone out of Y-DNA business, and may not be processing past submissions. Peter said that he had taken out UK membership. If goes to American page there is a DNA download. Kevan is saying that he doesn't see it either. Brian suggested to set up a BPM that Peter can install and makes it seem like he is in that place. Joanne suggested Peter should call both Ancestry and FTDNA and sent Peter phone numbers.

Kevan, when he does matching analysis. Not sure why not displaying since if there are matches it is clear that they have his results. Peter is on the member list, but do not show up on the results since they have not turned up sample, thus do not show up on any of the analysis. That Peter shows up with matches, means they have the information. It should be on FTDNA website. His site has a second number, not the Ancestry number or his results from them. Ask him to order kits, but no transferred results. Ordered kit from Ancestry. Received on October 24 and sent back on November 3rd. Said the results were available. Kevan asked which kit, A or B. Sent A kit. Kevan said not understanding. Been assigned a straight FTDNA number. When a transfer is done, assigned a number with a B or an N. FTDNA said the transfer had failed. Kevan saw the transfer but not the kit number. If had no results he shouldn't have matches. Joanne provided the phone number for FTDNA. Kevan said had matched with R1b, Crawford lineage B. Peter thinks they are re-doing it. Peter ordered the FTDNA kit for 67 markers. The kit had the number B20159. Other number 372412 is FTDNA number. The number that starts with a B is the transfer from Ancestry. In surname project his number is the B number. Joanne suggested Peter call and tell FTDNA he received two kit numbers. Peter will ask why has two kit numbers. Ancestry did not send kit, Kevan said then B number must be in error, since he did not receive any kit from Ancestry. Needs to ask why has B kit number. Did not ask for autosomal transfer.

Joanne said that Lineage B is a wide placed group, with Grant Crawford in NZ, Terry Lee Crawford in US, and Alexander Ian George Crawford in England. Several Greenock heiresses seemed to descend from the Greenock line. Patrick from Ireland has not received yet. Getting so big they are backlogged.

Karen asked about her group I2b1. Same as Harden, Lineage 6. Descendants of John Crawford who came to America in the 1650s. Earliest settlement included Jamestown. Kevan said that Jamestown failed. Plymouth was actually the first community. Married into Vanderbilts. Joanne said had not heard from him for quite a while. Wondered if he was OK. He was elderly. One of the founding members of the Association. Karen indicated that he was an exact match with her father. Kevan said fairly closely related. Karen asked Kevan if should increase number of markers. Not useful for small group. Kevan suggested member of lineage who had only done 12 markers, Michael Scott C. Karen had results for 37 markers. Kevan suggested they increase to 67, as best size to work with. Kevan said there is two mutation in 37 (one is CDY) with Harden. One mutation is father's, other is Harden's. Means common ancestor is 400 to 500 years away, but that is a rough estimate. Northern France is origin, Norman. Indicates its Nordic, I2 is a subgroup, but Kevan does not know which one it is. Karen said some matches in Balkans (Slovakia, Sardinia, Hungary, Croatia). Kevan indicated may be population migrations, though not necessarily related to origins. He asked for the links to percentages for haplogroup, or the maps of origins. Joanne wrote article on Harden's group. Has matches with — probability percentages. Karen will get article from a couple years ago, Oct. 2012 issue of newsletter. Joanne sent to Karen. Kevan said had changed nomenclature. FTDNA list haplogroup, then SNP code, M223 for Lineage 6 or I2b1 haplogroup. SNP gives more information. It's so much details that you can't see how branched out over thousands of years, just goes back to a few thousand years. Need some way to narrow SNP down, otherwise too many options (50 or so), so likely will choose the wrong one.
