Implement new member category, offering seniors 85 and over lifetime membership status. Implement plan to promote additional membership. c) Strengthening Regions: increasing regional participation & activities. d) Committees – Increased member participation in committees and other activities: all CCA members should participate on at least one committee. People would choose a committee to be on when join CCA. e) Expansion of Y-DNA project. f) Promotion of heraldry project. g) Cont. research on viability of Crawford Foundation, including identification of sources for funding.
3	Fall 2018 Board Elections (Joanne)	<p>Volunteers for Election - Fall Board Elections: (Presidents Note): We have another task with elections to the Board due in the fall. Please indicate by email to Peter who has oversight of the Election Committee (with a CC to myself) if you would like to participate on the Election Committee. It will consist of three members — as always. One of the three in consultation between the Election Committee and the Executive Committee will be chosen as chair. Please do volunteer to be on this very important committee. If we have more than three volunteers, three will be chosen from among them. Most board members will probably want to continue to be on the Board, and one of the committee responsibilities is to contact current Board members and confirm whether they wish to continue. We’ve already had some changes due to moving out of a region.</p> <p>Volunteers for election: Jay Crawford volunteered. Others will think about it.</p> <p>Last election we suffered a few glitches. We may have to modify the by-laws to resolve these inconsistencies so as to facilitate a smooth election process. The board will be informed of any proposed changes before the election, and you will have an opportunity to express your opinion and vote on them. We will do that either via the Board email or using the new bulletin board. All Communications on the Board bulletin board are confidential, and anything posted will only be able to be seen by the Board members.</p>

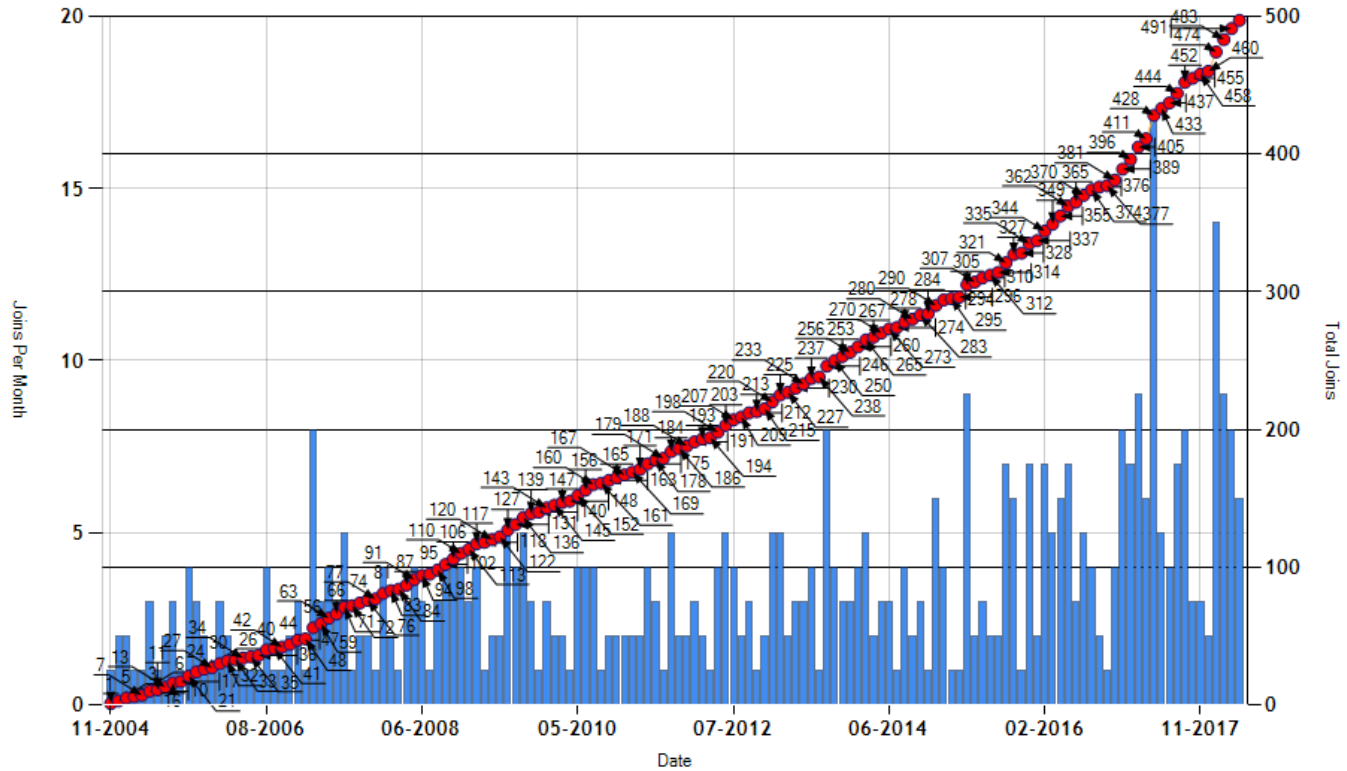
6	Website update: What's new – Peter / Julian	<p>The WEBSITE has had several new enhancements over the previous 12 months, and the outline of these are all covered in the Web Strategy Document, as authored by Peter Crawford, who has oversight of the Web Committee. The Web committee also met just after the AGM. The Web Strategy Document and the minutes of the WEB committee meeting are available on request. Please note, both documents are Internal to the CCA.</p> <p>Notwithstanding the above, here is a short bullet list of the major components:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> a) Website has been moved to a new BlueHost VM, so that it is now a stand-alone instance. This enables members of the Web committee to log on and do maintenance. b) Email for the Board and ExCom now set up c) Membership renewal emails now implemented. d) Emails to the Forum are also now added so that members are alerted to new content. e) New SSL Certificates are in the process of being issued. f) New Heraldry pages added g) DNA research pages refresh and re-organised h) New Regional Pages added <p>The Web Committee will now meet in their allocated workstreams to start managing the site in a collaborative manner. There is plenty still to be done so we're always looking for folk that have HTML experience.</p>
7	VP progress report on Genealogical research for Candidates for Chief – Raymond	<p>There is no prospect of reopening the Petition for the Chiefship until there is a change of officers at the Lyon Court which we anticipate to be sometime in the next two years. The present state of our genealogical research, which is ongoing, is probably adequate to begin another Petition when the time is right.</p>
8	VP report on Heraldry project - Raymond	<p>CCA Heraldry Report. April 2018</p> <p>At the time of the last ExComm meeting I reported that unfortunately Allen and I would not be able to present a paper on the CCA Armorial to the biennial international Congress on Heraldry and Genealogy in Arras, France, because the subject was not close enough to the theme of the Congress. However Allen has been invited to present his paper on our initiative to the biennial Congress of the (English) Heraldry Society in August in Winchester.</p> <p>Allen has been designing coats of arms for members of the CCA, and has now completed about 12. The template for the entry of these arms into the Register has been agreed by ExComm, and we now need to invite the new armigers to complete their part of the template so that they can be placed in the Register and published on the CCA website. Allen and I will be responsible for getting this under way.</p> <p>We would be delighted if other Crawfords would join in this initiative, which has already resulted in some stunning designs and we would recommend that this remains a regular feature of the Newsletter, perhaps by including one of the new designs in each issue. To clarify any possible uncertainty, there is no requirement that anyone seeking arms as part of this project should be a member of the CCA, only that they should be a Crawford, or of the family either by marriage or descent. It has been suggested that we might introduce interactive tutorials on heraldry for members of the CCA who would be interested and at this stage it would be helpful to have some idea of the amount of interest in laying this on.</p> <p>As noted previously and as reported again in the Newsletter, we do not recommend a further Petition for the Chiefship until at least 2020.</p>

Unfortunately our value proposition as an Association isn't as robust as it could be, and it today's highly motivated (and sometime toxic) Social Media driven world, it is hard to hold members attentions. As an Association that value statement comes in the form of the 3 Planks, Members content on the website, Genealogy and DNA projects and the Heraldry Project. All of these need to have high content for members, if we don't and give it away for free, then we're not providing a value service. As the Secretary I will take this to the next EXCOM AGM to get solid buy-in and then start to work them out via the committees. And in regard to Committees, we really need to get as many of these as possible into an active state. By doing so this will also create a strong CCA awareness and momentum in the regions.</p>

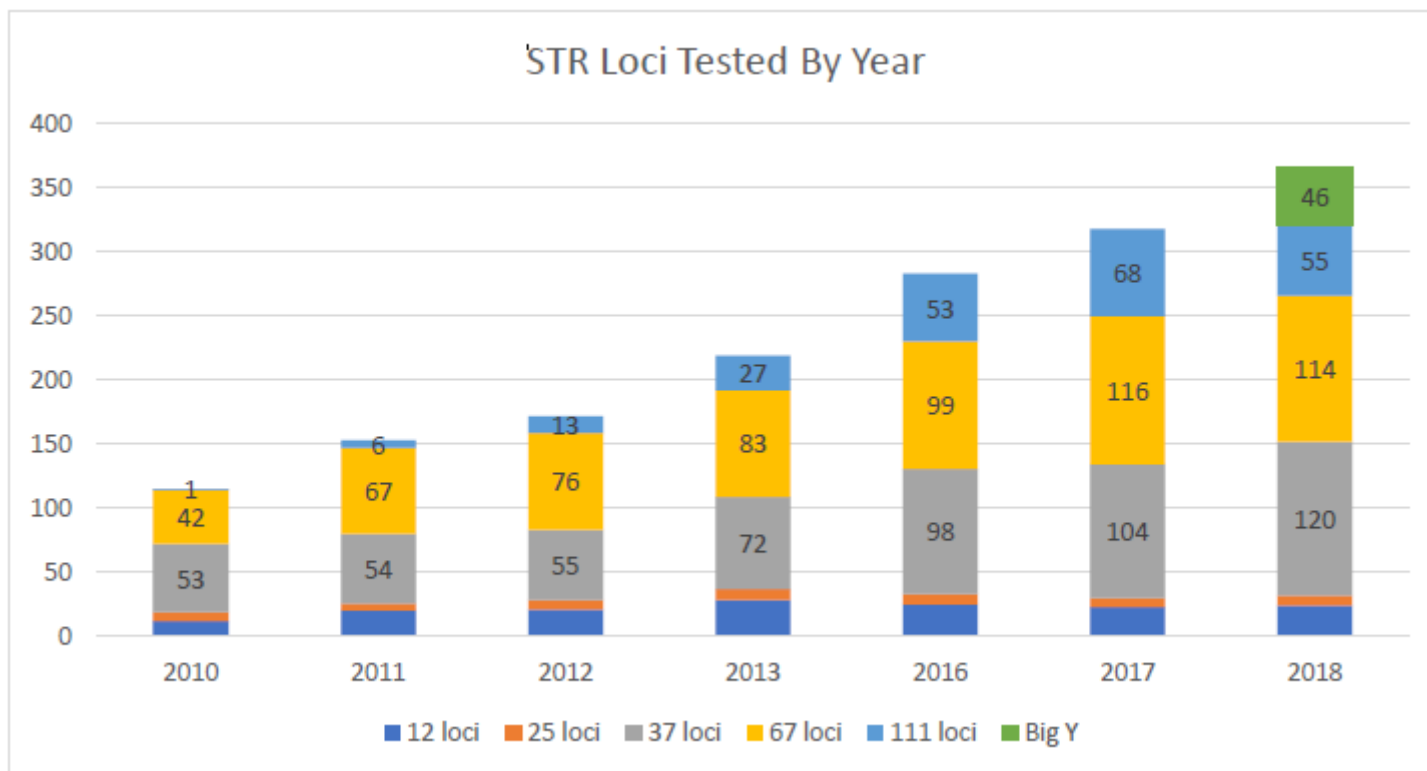


- We have individuals who have taken one or more Y-DNA test, individuals who have had their mitochondrial DNA tested; and those who have had a Family Finder autosomal analysis.
- We have members ranging from Australia, China, Slovakia, Italy, Netherlands, Belgium, St. Lucia as well as the major groups from Britain, Ireland, Canada, and the US.
- Pending lab Results - there are 16 pending lab results.

		<p>In addition to the STR data 130 individuals have obtained their mtDNA results; another 183 have obtained their Family Finder autosomal data. 62 have had their haplogroup confirmed through SNP testing while 79 have had no advanced SNP tests. We have also provided a report on the defined changes due to SNP testing in the Ardmillan-Baidland R1b lineages and have recently provided a more in-depth analysis of the R1a lineages. Also, a report on the most likely DNA trail for the Crawford who fought at Bannockburn was produced. We are also beginning to have a good understanding of the end SNPs for lineages R1b-7, R1b-9, R1b-13, R1b-15, R1b-20, and R1b-21. The first report on Crawford surname mitochondrial DNA results is pending and should be available in the coming weeks. We have also started providing updates on the latest Facebook discussions for the Newsletter. We consolidated the Y-DNA reports into one large spreadsheet which is available on our website in two formats. For non CCA members, the full name and the SNP testing information is not revealed. For members who login to the CCA website that data is available and in addition haplogroup specific reports area available that are not available to the general public. If the project continues to grow it maybe necessary to break the report into two or more reports in order to reduce file megabytes and also to make it easier to find specific lineages.</p> <p>Bruce A.
